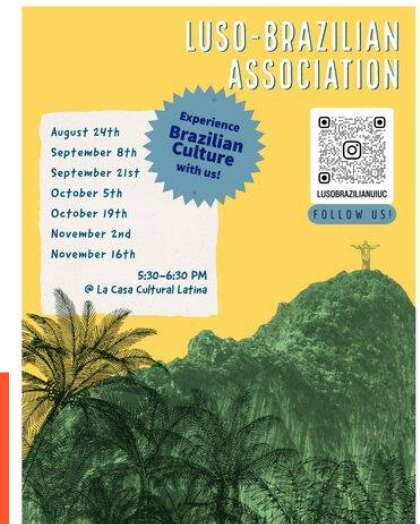

In this lecture, Marc Doussard, from the University of Illinois and guest speakers, Fabio Domingues Waltenberg and Jéssica Maldonado from the Federal Fluminense University will discuss about the Citizens' Basic Income, an unconditional cash transfer scheme paid in a local currency that benefits almost 50% of the 200,000 inhabitants of Maricá, Brazil. Speakers will describe the origins and the evolution of the program, as well as its diffusion to neighboring cities and its influence over national policies. Speakers will also present preliminary results from studies conducted by partner research groups and by our team - including firsthand results from "Building from the Bolsa", a project funded by the Lemann Center for Brazilian Studies.

LINKING ENVIRONMENT AND
ECONOMY, CONTRIBUTIONS OF
INPUT-OUTPUT ANALYSIS

Nobel laureate Wassily Leontief introduced input-output (I-O) models in the 1930s as a decision-making tool, providing a comprehensive understanding of economic processes such as production, income generation and consumption. These models go beyond economic applications and are valuable in environmental studies by linking economic and environmental variables. The presentation begins by describing the fundamental aspects of input-output theory and its relevance to environmental concerns. It then provides a detailed but non-exhaustive exploration of various applications of input-output models in environmental modeling, addressing limitations and suggesting potential extensions of the model. The presentation concludes by providing an overview of the future direction of input-output models in the field of environmental analysis.

Joaquim J.M. Guilhoto is a Senior Economist at the IMF. He worked at the OECD and as Professor at the University of São Paulo (USP), Brazil, where he also held positions as Head of the Department of Economics and as Associated Dean of the School of Economics, Management and Accounting (FEA). He has also held visiting professorships at MIT, University of Illinois, University Paris-Dauphine, and University of Lisbon. He specializes in applying input-output analysis to environmental analysis and sustainable development.

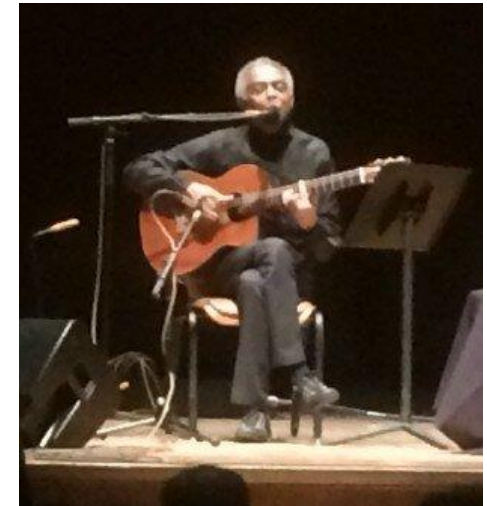
Celebrate BRAZILIAN ART & MUSIC
